Conservation Area

Bryanston is situated in a Conservation Area and AONB, it is special! As residents of Bryanston we have the responsibility to protect our trees. If any work at all must be undertaken to trees that are bigger than 7.5 centimetres in diameter, measured 1.5 metres above ground on your property, permission must be sought from Dorset Council Planning Department at least 6 weeks before work needs to be carried out.
